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#### Matthew 22:37–38

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<sup>36</sup>Now one of the Pharisees was requesting Him to dine with him, and He entered the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. <sup>37</sup>And there was a woman in the city who was a sinner; and when she learned that He was reclining at the table in the Pharisee's house, she brought an alabaster vial of perfume, <sup>38</sup>and standing behind Him at His feet, weeping, she began to wet His feet with her tears, and kept wiping them with the hair of her head, and kissing His feet and anointing them with the perfume.

<sup>39</sup>Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet He would know who and what sort of person this woman is who is touching Him, that she is a sinner." <sup>40</sup>And Jesus answered him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." - 3. VIP dinners were open affairs. (Onlookers permitted to observe.)







#### How much we love God

#### "for" can be read in two ways:

- 1. Her sins have been forgiven for she loved much.
- 2. Her sins have been forgiven because she loved much.

proof

#### "for" can be read in two ways:

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reason or cause

#### Jesus made the first move

"But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."

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

### Do not try to win God's forgiveness.

### The "tell" of being forgiven is apparent.

<sup>47</sup>"For this reason I say to you, her sins, which are many, have been forgiven, for she loved much; but he who is forgiven little, loves little."

#### Main Ideas

- 1. Love is the expected response to God's forgiveness of our sin.
- 2. How much you love God depends on how much you perceive you have been forgiven.
- 3. How you see your sin affects the amount of your love for God.
- 4. Question: Are you a big sinner or a little sinner?
- 5. It depends upon your ability to see yourself accurately! That's how much you will love God.

#### Contrasts

"sinful" woman

expresses love to Jesus

places faith in Jesus

sees self as a big sinner

attitude of worship

costly acts of love

(self-righteous) Pharisee

lack of love toward Jesus

doubts who Jesus is

sees self as a small sinner

attitude of skepticism

not even common courtesies

Jesus uses a parable of two debtors to talk about two different kinds of sinners.

# The word "sin" is interchangeable with the word "debt".

our debtors.





# The one thing which shuts a man off from God:

#### Self sufficiency

#### "The better a man is, the more he feels his sin."

#### "Biggest" sinners

Apostle Paul: "It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost of all." 1 Timothy 1:15

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Francis of Assisi: "There is nowhere a more wretched and a more miserable sinner than I."

The greatest of sins is to be conscious of no sin.

#### Luke 22:19-20

<sup>19</sup>And when He had taken some bread and given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me."

<sup>20</sup>And in the same way He took the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood.

#### 1 Corinthians 10:14-21
